#### NATURE OF THE CASE

- 1. This action is brought by Plaintiffs for injunctive relief against the City of Compton, California, for its violation of the California Voting Rights Act of 2001 (hereinafter the "CVRA"), Cal. Elec. Code §§ 14025, et seq. The imposition of the City of Compton's atlarge method of election has resulted in vote dilution for Latino residents and has denied them effective political participation in elections to the Compton City Council. The City of Compton's at-large method of election for electing members to its City Council prevents Latino residents from electing candidates of their choice or influencing the outcome of Compton's City Council elections.
- 2. The effects of the City of Compton's at-large method of election are apparent and compelling. Despite a Latino population of approximately 67.6% in the City of Compton, no Latino has ever been elected to Compton's City Council. Since 1999 there has been no candidate of choice of Latino voters elected to the Compton City Council. This current absence of any Latinos on the Compton City Council reveals a lack of access to the political process.
- 3. The City of Compton's at-large method of election violates the CVRA. Plaintiffs bring this action to enjoin the City of Compton's continued abridgment of Latino voting rights. Plaintiffs seek a declaration from this Court that the at-large method of election currently used by the City of Compton violates the CVRA. Plaintiffs seek injunctive relief enjoining the City of Compton from further imposing or applying its current at-large method of election. Further, Plaintiffs seek injunctive relief requiring the City of Compton to design and implement district-based elections or other alternative relief tailored to remedy Compton's violation of the CVRA.

#### **PARTIES**

4. Plaintiff Felicitas González is a registered voter residing in the City of Compton and is eligible to vote in the City of Compton's elections. Plaintiff González is Latina and is a member of a protected class under the CVRA.

- 5. Plaintiff Karmen Grimaldi is a registered voter residing in the City of Compton and is eligible to vote in the City of Compton's elections. Plaintiff Grimaldi is Latina and is a member of a protected class under the CVRA.
- 6. Plaintiff Flora Ruiz is a registered voter residing in the City of Compton and is eligible to vote in the City of Compton's elections. Plaintiff Ruiz is Latina and is a member of a protected class under the CVRA.
- 7. Defendant City of Compton, California, is a political subdivision subject to the provisions of the CVRA.
- 8. Defendant Alita Godwin is the City Clerk for the City of Compton, California, and is responsible for conducting elections for the Compton City Council. Defendant Godwin maintains information on registered voters and elections for the City of Compton.

#### JURISDICTION AND VENUE

9. All parties hereto are within the unlimited jurisdiction of this Court. The unlawful acts complained of occurred in this County. Venue in this Court is proper.

#### **FACTS**

- 10. The City of Compton contains approximately 93,955 persons, of which 63,471, or 67.6%, were Hispanic or Latino based upon the United States Census Bureau's 2009 American Community Survey One Year Estimates. According to this 2009 Census data, Latinos represent 43.4% of the citizen voting age population in Compton.
- 11. The Latino population located within the City of Compton is geographically concentrated.
- 12. The City of Compton is governed by a city council. The Compton City Council serves as the governmental body responsible for the operations of the City of Compton. The City Council is comprised of five members, a mayor and four council members.
- 13. The mayor for the City of Compton and the Compton City Council members are elected pursuant to an at-large method of election. Under this method of election, all of the eligible voters of the entire City of Compton elect the mayor and members to the City Council. Although each of the four City Council members must reside within one of four candidate

residency districts, each eligible voter places a vote for a candidate for each of the four candidate residency districts, regardless of where the voter resides.

- 14. Vacancies to the City Council are elected on a staggered basis; as a result, every two years the city electorate elects two City Council members who each serve a four year term. The mayor is elected for a term of four years.
- 15. For the time period from 1999 to 2010, no Latino candidate has been elected to the Compton City Council and no Latino candidate has been elected as City Clerk.
- 16. Plaintiffs are informed and believe that no Latino candidate has ever been elected to the Compton City Council or as City Clerk.
- 17. Elections conducted within the City of Compton are characterized by racially polarized voting. Racially polarized voting occurs when members of a protected class as defined by the CVRA, Cal. Elec. Code § 14025(d), vote for candidates and electoral choices that are different from the rest of the electorate. Racially polarized voting exists within the City of Compton because there is a difference between the choice of candidates or other electoral choices that are preferred by Latino voters and the choice of candidates or other electoral choices that are preferred by voters in the rest of the electorate.
- 18. Racially polarized voting consists both of voter cohesion on the part of Latino voters and of bloc voting by the non-Latino electorate against the choices of Latino voters. Such polarized voting is legally significant in Compton's City Council elections because it dilutes the opportunity of Latino voters to elect candidates of their choice.
- 19. Patterns of racially polarized voting have the effect of impeding opportunities for Latino voters to elect candidates of their choice to the at-large city council positions in the City of Compton, where the non-Latino majority dominates elections. At least since 1994, Latino voters have been harmed by racially polarized voting. At least since 1999, Latino voters in the City of Compton have not elected a single Latino candidate of their choice to any one of the four city council positions and the offices of the Mayor and the City Clerk.
- 20. For the 2001 City of Compton elections, Latinos ran for the offices of mayor, city council member and city clerk. Juan R. Mora is a Latino who ran for the office of mayor.

Robert Carrillo is a Latino who ran for City Council District 2. Evaristo Garcia is a Latino who ran for City Council District 3. Elias Acevedo is a Latino who ran for City Clerk. Juan R. Mora, Robert Carrillo, Evaristo Garcia and Elias Acevedo were the Latino candidates of choice in the 2001 City of Compton elections. The Latino candidates of choice in the 2001 City of Compton elections were not elected.

- 21. The 2001 City of Compton elections were racially polarized. Latino voters supported the candidacies of Juan R. Mora, Robert Carrillo, Evaristo Garcia and Elias Acevedo. The rest of the electorate did not support the Latino candidates of choice.
- 22. In the 2005 City of Compton elections, Latinos ran for the offices of mayor, city council member and city clerk. Juan R. Mora is a Latino who ran for the office of mayor. Joel Estrada is a Latino who ran for City Council District 2. Evaristo Garcia is a Latino who ran for City Council District 3. Elias Acevedo is a Latino who ran for City Clerk. Joel Estrada, Evaristo Garcia and Elias Acevedo were the Latino candidates of choice in the 2005 City of Compton elections. Mr. Estrada, Mr. Garcia, and Mr. Acevedo were not elected.
- 23. The 2005 City of Compton elections were racially polarized. Latino voters supported the candidacies of Joel Estrada, Evaristo Garcia and Elias Acevedo. The rest of the electorate did not support the Latino candidates of choice.
- 24. In the 2009 City of Compton elections, Latinos ran for the city council. Elias Acevedo is a Latino who ran for City Council District 2. Diana Sanchez is a Latina who ran for City Council District 3. Elias Acevedo and Diana Sanchez were the Latino candidates of choice in the 2009 City of Compton elections. The Latino candidates of choice in the 2009 City of Compton elections were not elected.
- 25. The 2009 City of Compton elections were racially polarized. Latino voters supported the candidacies of Elias Acevedo and Diana Sanchez. The rest of the electorate did not support the Latino candidates of choice.
- 26. The 1994 election for State Proposition 187, which involved the denial of governmental benefits to persons who could not demonstrate legal residence, was racially

polarized in Compton. Latino voters voted against State Proposition 187, while the rest of the electorate in Compton supported the passage of State Proposition 187.

- 27. The at-large method of election and repeated racially polarized voting has caused Latino vote dilution within the City of Compton. Where Latinos and the rest of the electorate express different preferences on candidates and other electoral choices, non-Latino voters, by virtue of their overall numerical supermajority among eligible voters, defeat the preferences of Latino voters.
- 28. The obstacles posed by the City of Compton's at-large method of election, together with racially polarized voting, impair the ability of Latino voters to elect candidates of their choice or to influence the outcome of elections conducted in the City of Compton.
- 29. An alternative method of election exists, such as district-based elections, that will provide an opportunity for the members of the protected class as defined by the CVRA to elect candidates of their choice or to influence the outcome of Compton City Council elections.

# FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION (Violation of California Voting Rights Act of 2001, Cal. Elec. Code § 14025 et. seq.) (Against All Defendants)

- 30. Plaintiffs refer to and incorporate paragraphs 1 to 29 as though fully set forth herein.
- 31. Plaintiffs are registered voters and reside within the City of Compton, California. Plaintiffs are Latina and are members of a protected class of voters under the CVRA. Plaintiffs are over the age of 18 and are eligible to vote in the City of Compton's elections.
  - 32. Defendant City of Compton is a political subdivision within the State of California.
- 33. Defendant City of Compton employs an at-large method of election, where voters of its entire jurisdiction elect members to its City Council.
- 34. Racially polarized voting has occurred, and continues to occur, in elections for members to the City Council for the City of Compton and in elections incorporating other electoral choices by voters of Compton. As a result, the City of Compton's at-large method of
