# PROTEST AGAINST NOMINATION PETITION OF GARY JOHNSON AND JAMES GRAY AS CANDIDATES OF THE LIBERTARIAN PARTY FOR THE OFFICES OF PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

Protestors KELLY MILLS and CYNTHIA REES respectfully submit this written protest against the nomination petition of Gary Johnson and James Gray as the candidates of the Libertarian Party for the offices of President and Vice President of the United States, pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code § 3513.263. Protestors MILLS and REES are qualified electors of the State of Ohio who are eligible to vote for Messrs. Johnson and Gray. *See* Declaration of [KELLY MILLS], ¶¶ 3-5, *attached as* Exh. 1; Declaration of CYNTHIA REES, ¶¶ 3-5, *attached as* Exh. 2.

Gary Johnson is ineligible to appear on the ballot as the Libertarian Party's candidate for the office of President of the United States under Ohio's "sore loser" statute, Ohio Rev. Code § 3513.04. That law provides, in relevant part, "[1] No person who seeks party nomination for an office or position at a primary election [2] by declaration of candidacy . . . [3] shall be

permitted to become a candidate by nominating petition . . . at the following general election for any office." Ohio Rev. Code § 3513.04. This statute squarely applies here. <sup>1</sup>

*First*, Gary Johnson sought "party nomination for an office or position at a primary election." *Id.* Johnson sought the 2012 Republican nomination for the office of President in numerous presidential preference primaries, including in the States of Florida,<sup>2</sup> New Hampshire,<sup>3</sup> Michigan,<sup>4</sup> Missouri,<sup>5</sup> South Carolina,<sup>6</sup> Georgia,<sup>7</sup> Tennessee,<sup>8</sup> and Mississippi.<sup>9</sup> Gary Johnson

In Libertarian Party of Ohio v. Husted, No. 2:11-CV-722, Nunc Pro Tunc Order at 1 (S.D. Ohio Oct. 18, 2011), attached as Exh. 4, the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Ohio stated that the Libertarian Party may "appear[] on the ballot for the November 2011 and November 2012 elections." It added, however, "The LPO and its candidates must still satisfy all other applicable filing requirements as required by state law for political party and candidate eligibility, with the exception of those contained in O.R.C. § 3517.01(A)(1) [concerning signature requirements]." Id. (emphasis added). Because Gary Johnson's candidacy violates Ohio Rev. Code § 3513.04, he does not "satisfy all other applicable . . . requirements . . . [for] candidate eligibility." Thus, the court's order does not allow the Libertarian Party to have Gary Johnson appear on the 2012 general election ballot as its candidate for President.

neither won any of these elections, nor was selected as the Republican Party's candidate for President of the United States.

Second, Johnson participated in several of those primaries "by declaration of candidacy." *Id.* Multiple states required him to file a declaration of candidacy to participate in their presidential primaries. *See, e.g.*, N.H. Rev. Stat. § 655:47(I) ("The names of any persons to be voted upon as candidates for president at the presidential primary shall be printed on the ballots upon the filing of declarations of candidacy with the secretary of state."); *see also* Mo. Rev. Stat. § 115.761(1) ("The official list of presidential candidates for each established political party shall include the names of all constitutionally qualified candidates for whom . . . before 5:00 p.m., on the eleventh Tuesday prior to the presidential primary, a written request to be included on the presidential primary ballot is filed with the secretary of state.").

Third, Gary Johnson is now seeking to "become a candidate" of the Ohio Libertarian Party for President of the United States in Ohio's November 2012 general election. Ohio Rev. Code § 3513.04. The "sore loser" law applies when a person seeks to become a candidate "by nominating petition." Id. The Libertarian Party, of course, filed a "Certificate of Nomination" to name Gary Johnson as its presidential candidate. See Exh. 3. State law provides, however, that the Libertarian Party also must file a petition to be able to nominate candidates such as Mr. Johnson for offices such as President. See Ohio Rev. Code § 3517.01(A)(1) (holding that a

group qualifies as a "political party" eligible to place candidates on the ballot if it submits "a petition signed by qualified electors").

In *Libertarian Party of Ohio v. Husted*, No. 2:11-CV-722, *Nunc Pro Tunc* Order at 1 (S.D. Ohio Oct. 18, 2011), *attached as* Exh. 4, the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Ohio held that the Secretary of State could not exclude the Libertarian Party from nominating candidates for the office of President (or other offices) on the grounds that the Party failed to comply with § 3517.01(A)(1) petition requirement; the court earlier had held that § 3517.01(A)(1) would be unconstitutional under such circumstances. Thus, pursuant to the *Nunc Pro Tunc* Order, the Secretary of State is required to treat the Libertarian Party and its candidates, including Gary Johnson, as if they had properly filed such a Petition. *Id.* Because this Order requires the Secretary to treat § 3517.01(A)(1)'s petition requirements as constructively fulfilled, the Secretary should maintain consistency by concluding that the "petition" requirements of the "sore loser" law, § 3513.04, likewise have been constructively fulfilled.

Perhaps more importantly, the "sore loser" law is in its very nature and essence a remedial statute. The U.S. Supreme Court has recognized that such laws play an important function in the electoral process by helping states "avert[] divisive sore-loser candidacies." *Burdick v. Takushi*, 504 U.S. 428, 439 (1992), and ensure that "[t]he general election is reserved for candidates with broad based support," *Cooley v. Keisling*, 45 F. Supp. 2d 818, 822 (D. Or. 1999). Indeed, *specifically with regard to the Libertarian Party*, the U.S. Supreme Court has held that allowing a candidate "who senses defeat [to] launch a 'sore loser' candidacy by defecting to the LPO [Libertarian Party] primary" is likely to lead to "party splintering and excessive factionalism," which states have an interest in preventing. *Clingman v. Beaver*, 544

U.S. 581, 596 (2005) (quotation marks omitted and emphasis added); *see also Timmons v. Twin Cities Area New Party*, 520 U.S. 351, 369 (1997) (discussing the state's "weighty . . . interests in ballot integrity and political stability").

Thus, as a remedial statute, the "sore loser" law "should receive a broad and liberal construction to effect the purposes of its enactment." *Convenient Food Mart, Inc. v. Ohio Liquor Cont. Comm'n*, 2010 Ohio 4612, ¶ 14 (10th App. Dist.), *quoting Miami Cty. v. Dayton*, 92 Ohio St. 215, 219-20, 110 N.E. 726, 728 (1915). Indeed, the Court of Appeals has emphasized that "statutes . . . [that] are remedial in character . . . are to be liberally construed and given *the broadest interpretation possible*." *Hess v. City of Toledo*, 133 Ohio App. 3d 729, 735, 729 N.E.2d 823, 827 (6th App. Dist. 1999) (emphasis added). The Secretary therefore should decline to adopt a narrow, cramped reading of the "sore loser" statute, and strive to give the law full effect by reading it broadly to apply to Mr. Johnson's nomination. Having unsuccessfully sought the Republican nomination for President of the United States by participating in the presidential preference primaries in numerous states, Ohio law now prohibits Gary Johnson from running in the general election for that office.

#### CONCLUSION

For these reasons, Protestors respectfully request that the Secretary of State uphold this Protest, decline to include Gary Johnson on the ballot as a candidate for President of the United States, and deem the Libertarian Party's nominations for the offices of President and Vice President of the United States legally invalid.



#### **NUNC PRO TUNC ORDER**

This matter comes before the Court following a status conference held on October 17, 2011, during which Plaintiffs Libertarian Party of Ohio ("LPO"), Kevin Knedler, and Michael Johnston requested certain clarifications as to the affect of this Court's September 7, 2011, Order ("the Order") granting a Preliminary Injunction. (Dkt. 13.)

The import of the Order was to ensure that the LPO appears on the ballot for the November 2011 and November 2012 elections. Defendant Husted is hereby ordered, *nunc pro tunc*, to ensure that the LPO is placed on the November 2011 and November 2012 ballots. The LPO and its candidates must still satisfy all other applicable filing requirements as required by state law for political party and candidate eligibility, with the exception of those contained in O.R.C. § 3517.01(A)(1).
